Unpainted, unplastered, unpanelled, and uncladded walls evoke the essence of a construction site, while the interior design mirrors this theme, capturing its ephemeral nature while emphasizing sustainability. Strategic incorporation of bold colours infuses vibrancy into these raw elements.

### GREEN LANDSCAPE

Upon entering, visitors are greeted by a breathtaking sight—a large-scale model of the entire project. This centrepiece underscores the project's significance while igniting curiosity and engagement. Adjacent to the model lies an interactive zone featuring a reception area and facilities for engagement and information exchange. The layout encompasses a café, self-help pantry, utilities, restrooms, sales cubicles, an audiovisual room, a conference room, and a director's chamber to cater to diverse business needs. Throughout the space, round tables provide comfort for visitors during discussions and moments of relaxation.

Additionally, the project prioritises landscaping, impeccably integrating nature into its design. The site entrance aligns strategically with the overall project's entrance, setting the stage for a striking landscape design. Thoughtful landscaping follows contour blocks, with each block designated for specific plantations, resulting in a visually appealing and sustainable landscape. This thoughtful approach considers views from the sales gallery, offering glimpses of greenery and providing a refreshing visual respite. Commitment to sustainability extends to the efficient use of raw materials, waste minimisation, and a reduced environmental footprint. Actual plants are meticulously placed indoors and on the ground level, creating a biophilic environment that forms a tranquil oasis within the bustling space, enhancing the overall atmosphere.

### **ECO-FRIENDLY, COST-EFFECTIVE & DYNAMIC**

The interior design of the sales gallery underscores Orbit Group's unwavering commitment to sustainability. While embracing the raw aesthetics of a construction site, the project gives precedence to eco-friendly materials and future dismantling. This approach ensures that the project doesn't entail excessive expenditure, only to be dismantled in a few years, rendering it a sustainable and cost-effective solution.

The project's material palette deliberately echoes the construction site's aesthetics, embracing its raw and industrial character. Sustainability takes centre stage, with a meticulous selection of materials designed for future dismantling and repurposing. Bricks, purposefully minimally clad, have been chosen for easy reuse once the anticipated five-year project lifespan concludes. Functional partitions, constructed using paver blocks, serve a dual purpose by offering separation within the space and housing pockets of greenery. These living

The project faced the challenge of adhering to a tight budget and a 75-day timeline from inception to completion. So, the design team focused on utilising cost-effective yet sustainable materials. Artificial cladding was avoided, and bricks, paver blocks, and easily

removable ceiling panels were chosen for their affordability and potential for repurposing. The team's dedication to a cohesive design approach enabled them to successfully meet the project's objectives.
